Traditional boats (only boats with fixed seats and no outriggers are eligible for prizes)



## Division 3 (Long) 1:30pm - Pulls Ferry to Broadland

Women's Coxed Fours; Open/Mixed Quads (coxed & coxless); Women's Doubles
