



## **Whitlingham Boat House Waste Management**

Whitlingham Boat House is a Community based centre for Rowing and Canoeing. It undertakes to run its facilities with consideration to the environment and local County Council policy, which can be found at the [www.south-norfolk.gov.uk](http://www.south-norfolk.gov.uk).

The building is constructed to minimise energy usage and reclaim heat to be recycled throughout the centre. Solar energy is utilised to heat water.

Sewage is directed to an environmentally friendly system which produces water suitable to discharge under an Environment Agency licence to the local river network, along with runoff water from the building.

### **The site produces five types of wastes as part of its operation:-**

Recyclable

General Rubbish

Hazardous

Sanitary

Cooking Oils

Disposal of the waste from the centre has three different streams. To facilitate two of these there are purpose allocated wheeled bins. A green bin is designated for recycling and a grey/black for general waste. These are located in the rear of the Rowing boat house adjacent to the lobby entrance. Sub bins are located throughout the building and clearly designated for the use of general patrons. These are emptied as required into the main receptacles. The wheeled bins are collected on a bi weekly basis by South Norfolk District Council. The bins are placed at the centre collection point adjacent to the main doors in advance of emptying on Friday's by 6-30am.

The third method of disposal is by appointed persons at the County Council Recycling Centres which has designated areas for Hazardous waste, Cooking Oils, electrical, asbestos and bulk items.

### **Waste Designated as Recyclable which can be placed in Green Bin**

Paper and cardboard

Plastic Bottles

Steel and aluminium cans and tins – rinsed and uncrushed



Glass bottles and Jars - rinsed and lids left on

Food pots, tubs and trays

Waxed food and drink cartons – rinsed out without lids

Foil and foil containers

Empty aerosol cans

**Waste NOT to be placed in Green Recycled bin**

Plastic bags cling film and junk mail bags

DIY waste

Garden Waste

Textiles

Sharps and Needles

Food Waste

Any other domestic waste

**General waste to be disposed of in Grey/Black Bin**

All non-recycling waste with the exceptions of specialist, cooking oil. Sanitary and hazardous waste.

**Hazardous Waste**

Tins of paint

Weed Killers and bug sprays

None empty aerosols

Fuel

Engine Oil

Cleaners and solvents

Fillers

The storage of these items are in purpose designed cabinets located in the centre of Boat House 1 or the red cabinet adjacent to the south side of Boat house 2. Hazardous waste is to be disposed of at the local South Norfolk Recycling Centres. These are at Wellbeck Road, Bergh Apton and Station Lane, Ketteringham. There are specialist allocated areas within these.



### **Sanitary Items**

Sanitary receptacles are in each of the ladies and disabled toilets. These are removed by specialist contract service maintained as part of the cleaning contract. They are disposed of as per their protocol.

### **Cooking Oils**

Cooking Oils should be placed in plastic bottles and removed from site to be disposed of in the red bins at designated collection points that can be found at [www.south-norfolk.gov.uk](http://www.south-norfolk.gov.uk) or at the Wellbeck Road, Bergh Apton and Station Lane, Ketteringham recycling centres.
